



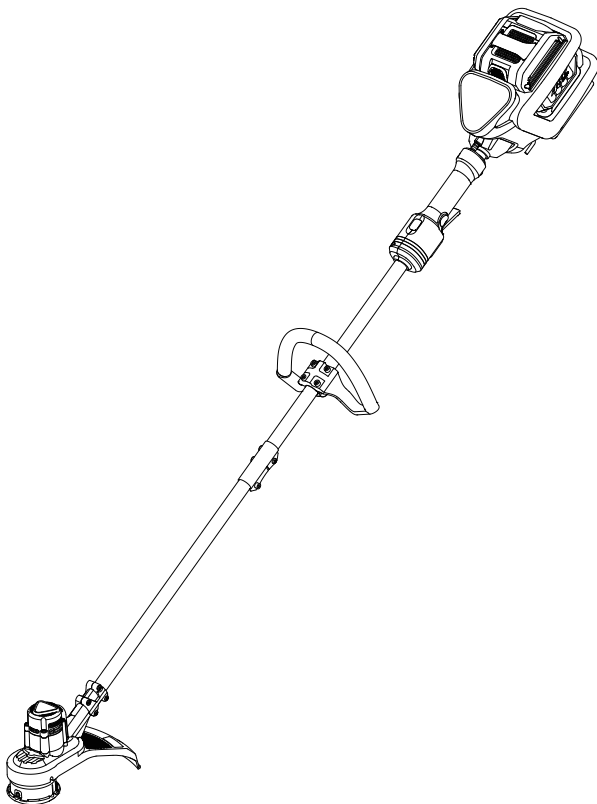

FOR ALL APPLIANCES

- Avoid dangerous environments — do not use appliances in damp or wet locations.
- Don't use in rain.
- Keep children away — all people and pets should be kept at a distance from the work area.
- Dress properly — do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. They can be caught in moving parts. Wear protective clothing; use of work gloves, long pants, a long-sleeved shirt and safety footwear is recommended when working outdoors. Wear protective hair covering to contain long hair.
- Use safety glasses — always use face or dust mask if the area in which you are working is dusty.

2. Disconnect the battery pack from the appliance before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing appliance. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the appliance accidentally.
3. Recharge only with the charger specified by the manufacturer. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.

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

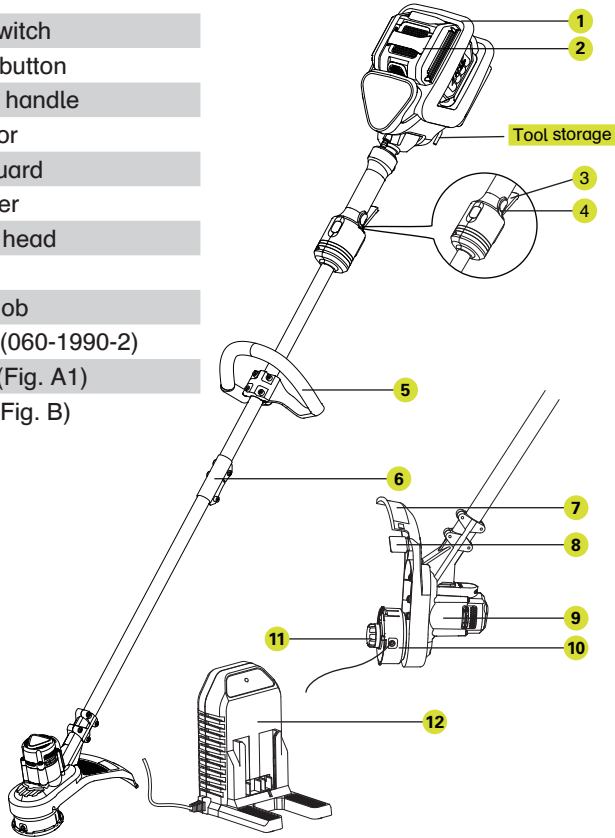

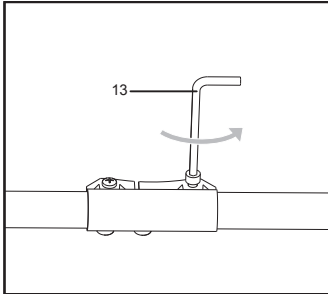

Intended Use

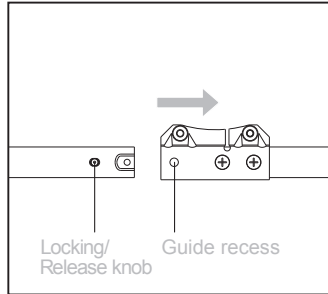
The machine is intended for the cutting of grass and weeds under bushes, as well as on slopes and edges that cannot be reached with the lawn mower.

1. ASSEMBLING THE UPPER SHAFT AND LOWER SHAFT

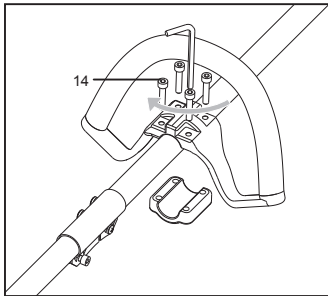
- 1) Loosen the bolt on the connector. (see Fig. A1.)
- 2) Align and insert the lower shaft directly into the upper shaft. (see Fig. A2.)
- 3) Position the locking/release button into the guide recess. (see Fig. A2.)

2. ASSEMBLING THE AUXILIARY HANDLE

Place the auxiliary handle onto the shaft from the top, align with the anti-vibration circle on the shaft, insert the screws into the four holes, and tighten them with the wrench. (see Fig. B.)



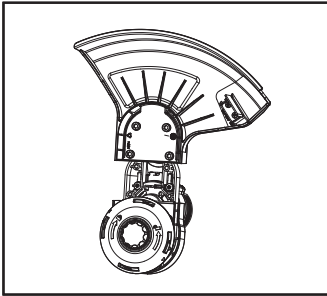

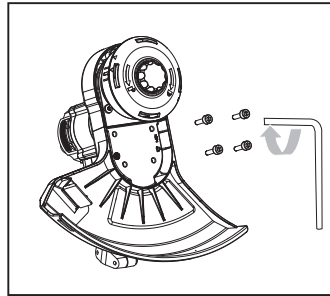

3. Assembling the safety guard

Attach the safety guard to the trimmer head. Align the guard so it slides into the slots located on the trimmer head. (see Fig. C1.) Secure the safety guard onto the trimmer head with the screw provided. (see Fig. C2.)

BEFORE OPERATION

1. CHARGING THE BATTERY PACK

IMPORTANT NOTES FOR CHARGING BATTERY

The battery in your new tool is not charged when it leaves the plant; therefore, it must be fully charged before using the first time.

NOTE: If the battery pack is very hot, remove the battery from the charger and allow it to cool to ambient temperature before attempting to recharge.

To prevent damage to the battery pack, please charge the battery to full or no less than half charge before storage.

If the tool will not be used for long periods of time, charge the battery every 3-6 months.

CHARGING PROCEDURE (SEE FIG. D)

- 1) Plug the charger into an appropriate outlet.
- 2) Slide the battery pack into the charger; the light will begin flashing green to indicate the charging process has started.
- 3) When charging is completed, the light will turn solid green. The pack is now fully charged; unplug the charger and remove the battery pack.



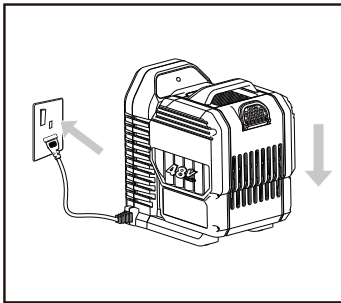
WARNING: When battery charge runs out after continuous use or exposure to direct sunlight or heat, allow time for the battery to cool down before re-charging to achieve the full charge.



WARNING! Use caution when assembling the safety guard as the guard has a very sharp line cutter.









WARNING! Never operate the tool without the guard properly in place. Use of the unit without having installed the guard may result in injury.

CHARGING INDICATOR

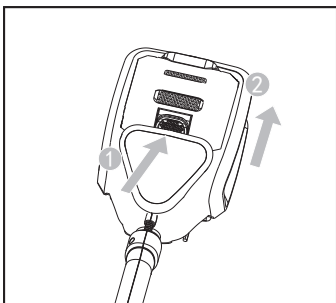
This charger is designed to detect some problems that can arise with battery packs. Indicator lights indicate problems (see table below).

Light	ON/ Flash	Status
Red on ● 	————	Defective battery.
Red flash  	Battery Temperature Protection. The temperature of battery pack is less than 0°C (32°F) or more than 40°C (104°F).
Green on ● 	————	Fully charged.
Green flash  	Charging.

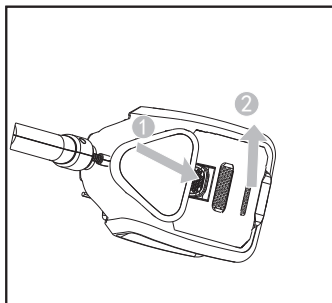
2. INSTALLING AND REMOVING THE BATTERY PACK

Slide the battery pack into tool's battery port. A simple push and slight pressure will be sufficient. (See Fig. E1.)

Press the battery pack latch and remove the battery pack from the tool. (See Fig. E2.)



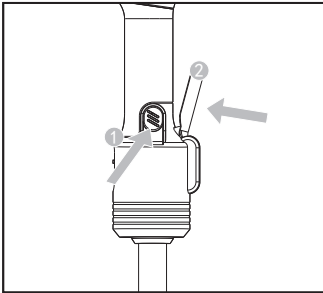

1. SWITCH ON/OFF

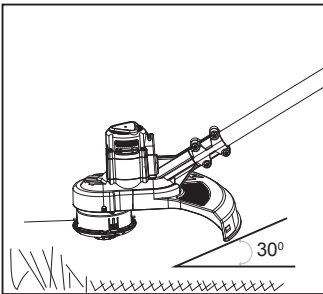
To switch on, press the lock-off button first, then the On/Off Switch. (See Fig. F.)
To switch off, release the On/Off Switch.



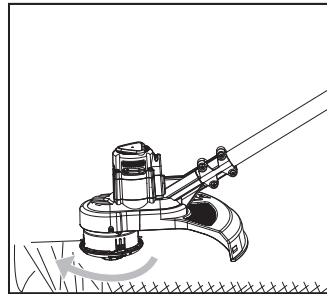

2. TRIMMING

- 1) Keep the trimmer head at an angle of about 30° to the ground when trimming. (See Fig. G1.)
- 2) Do not cut wet grass because it tends to stick to the trimmer head and guard, prevents proper discharge of grass clippings, and could cause you to slip and fall.
- 3) Regularly remove clippings and dirt around the trimmer head. Ensure the trimmer is switched off.
- 4) Work rhythmically; stand firmly with your feet apart. Cut from right to left so the trimmings will be thrown away from the work area. (see Fig. G2.)
- 5) When cutting longer/high grass, please make sure that you cut it down in 2 to 3 stages. (see Fig. G3, G4.)
- 6) Do not move the trimmer too fast as this will result in ineffective cutting and possible damage.

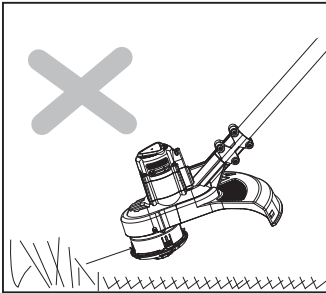

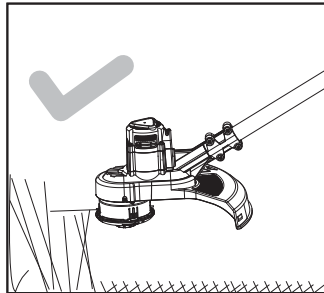

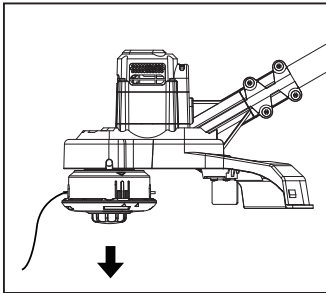

3. ADJUSTING CUTTING LINE LENGTH—AUTOMATIC BUMP LINE FEED

The trimmer head allows the operator to release more cutting line without stopping the motor. As line becomes frayed or worn, additional line can be released by lightly tapping the bump knob on the ground while operating the trimmer. (see Fig. H.)

NOTE: Line release will become more difficult if the cutting line becomes too dull.



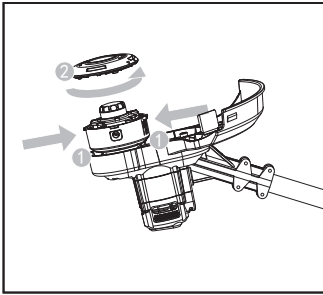

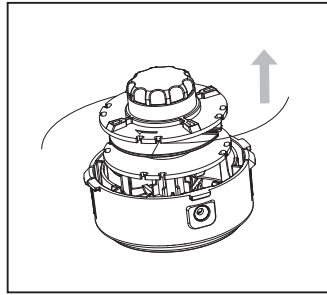
WARNING: Do not remove or alter the line-cutting blade assembly. Excessive line length will be cut to suitable length.

4. TO REPLACE THE SPOOL AND LINE

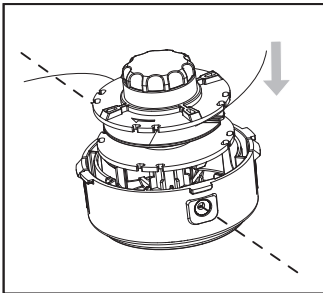
- 1) For your convenience, it is recommended you buy a replacement spool with line.
 - 2) Press and hold in the two cap release latches. Loosen the cap by rotating it counter-clockwise. Pull cap away from the spool holder. (see Fig. I1.)
 - 3) Remove old spool. (see Fig. I2.)
 - 4) Place new spool into cutting head. Release one line from cleat and feed line through eyelet. (see Fig. I3.)
 - 5) Replace the cap on the spool holder and turn the cap clockwise to tighten. (see Fig. I4.)
- NOTE:** If required, line can be fed out manually. Gently pull out the 2 lines out until the lines reach the line cutter. If the line extends past the line cutter, too much line has been fed out. If too much line is fed out, remove the spool cap and click spool counter-clockwise until the line is at the desired length.



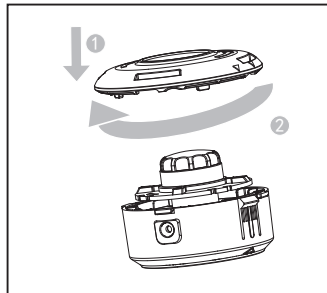

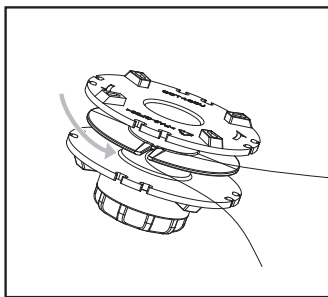

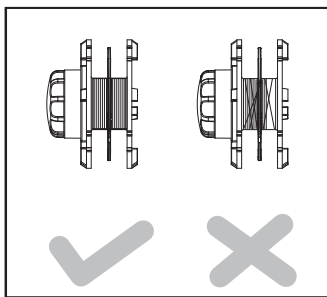
NOTE: Remove battery prior to replacing the spool and line.

5. TO REPLACE THE LINE ON THE SPOOL

- 1) Cut a piece of line approximately 16' (4.9 m) long.
- 2) Insert the centre point of line into the notch in the middle section of the spool and wind the line in a clockwise direction as shown. (see. Fig. J1.)
- 3) Care should be taken to ensure that the line is neatly coiled on the spool. Failure to do so will impair the efficiency of the automatic bump line feed. (see. Fig. J2.)
- 4) Fit the spool as described in "To Replace the Spool and Line".

WARNING! Your trimmer is designed to only use line with a maximum diameter of 0.08" (2 mm).



Always remove the battery pack from your trimmer after use.

MAINTENANCE

Always check the product prior to use for any damage.

After use, disconnect the battery from the tool and check for damage.

Your power tool requires no additional lubrication or maintenance. There are no user-serviceable parts in your power tool. Never use water or chemical cleaners to clean your power tool. Wipe clean with a dry cloth. Always store your power tool in a dry, room-temperature location. Keep the motor ventilation slots clean. Keep all working controls free of dust.

For Battery Tools

The ambient temperature range for the use and storage of tool and battery is 0 to 45°C (32 to 113°F).

The recommended ambient temperature range for the charging system during charging is 0 to 40°C (32 to 104°F).

It is recommended that the battery be stored indoors for the winter months.

Store in a dry place where the trimmer and battery can be protected from damage.

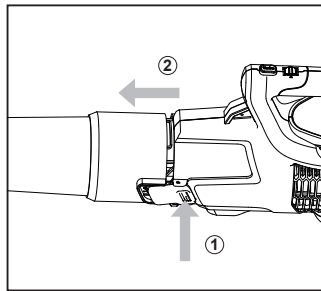
Before assembling the blower tube, be sure the on/off switch is in "O" Off position. Insert the blower tube directly to the motor housing as shown in Fig. A1. Be sure to align the tube release button with the buckle on the motor housing. Check to see if the blower tube is firmly secured.

- REMOVING (SEE FIG. A2)

Before disassembling the blower tube, be sure the on/off switch is in "O" Off position. Press the tube release button, so you can separate the tube. Pull the blower tube out from the motor housing. Do not try to separate the tubes by force or by using tools.

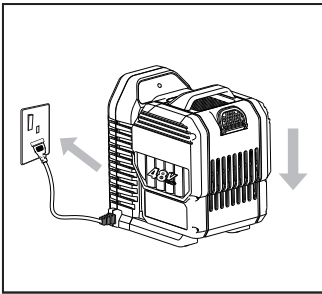
1. CHARGING THE BATTERY (SEE FIG. B)

- The battery in your new tool is not charged when it leaves the plant. Therefore it must be fully charged before using the first time.
- If the battery pack is very hot, remove the battery from the charger and allow it to cool to ambient temperature before attempting to recharge.
- To prevent damage to the battery pack, please charge the battery to full or no less than half charge before storage.
- If the tool will not be used for long periods of time, charge the battery pack every 3-6 months.

CHARGING PROCEDURE

- Plug the charger into an appropriate outlet.
- Slide the battery pack into the charger; make sure the battery is in the correct charge position firmly. The light will begin flashing green to indicate the charging process has started.

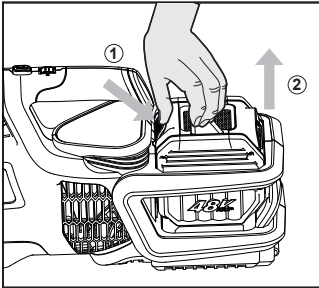

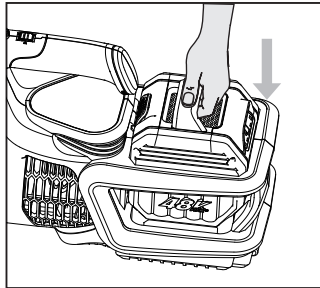

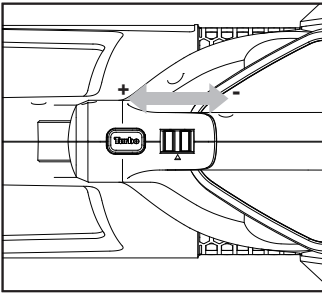

- VARIABLE SPEED CONTROL

The on/off switch with variable speed (2) controls the airflow. The airflow can be adjusted from the minimum to maximum by pushing the on/off switch forward. The airflow increases slowly when the on/off switch is pushed forward gradually.

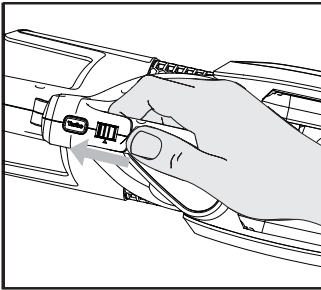

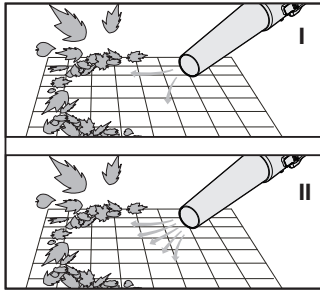

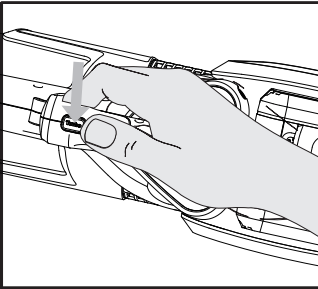

Release the turbo button, and the blower will return to the previously selected speed.
