

This snow shovel is capable of amputating hands and feet and throwing objects. Failure to observe the following safety instructions could result in serious injury.

IMPORTANT!

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

ALL OPERATORS MUST READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE USE

Read all instructions before using this cordless snow shovel. Basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and personal injury.

GENERAL SAFETY WARNINGS!

You and any other operator of this snow shovel must read, understand and follow these instructions in their entirety, and should reread them at the start of each snow season. Failure to follow these instructions may result in ELECTRIC SHOCK, FIRE and/or serious PERSONAL INJURY.

Notice the personal safety alert symbol \triangle is used in this manual to draw your attention to a WARNING given along with the particular operating instruction. This means that the operation requires special ATTENTION, CAUTION and AWARENESS.

- **Keep work area clean and well lit** Cluttered, dark areas invite accidents.
- **Use the right product** Do not use this machine for any job except that for which it is intended.
- Replacement parts When servicing this unit, use only identical replacement parts. Replace or repair damaged cord immediately on the charger. Do not use on gravel surfaces unless the snow shovel is adjusted for such surfaces in accordance with the operator's manual.

- Keep children, bystanders and pets away All spectators, including pets, should be kept a safe distance away from the work area.
- Dress properly Do not wear loose articles of clothing or jewellery. They can become caught in moving parts. Wear rubber boots.
- Avoid accidental starting Make sure the safety switch and the trigger switch are in the off
 position before inserting the battery in the unit. Do not carry the cordless snow shovel with the
 safety switch and the trigger switch engaged.
- Moving parts Keep hands and feet away from moving parts. Keep guards in place and in proper working order.
- CAUTION! Exercise caution to avoid slipping or falling. Wear protective footwear that will protect
 your feet and improve your footing on slippery surfaces.
- Use safety glasses Also use safety footwear, snug-fitting clothing, protective gloves, hearing
 and head protection.
- Stay alert Watch what you are doing. Use common sense. Do not operate the cordless snow shovel when you are tired or under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- Do not force the tool It will perform better with less likelihood of personal or mechanical
 injury if it is used at the rate for which it was designed.
- **Do not overreach** Keep proper footing and balance at all times.
- If the cordless snow shovel strikes a foreign object, follow these steps:
 - Stop the cordless snow shovel. Remove the battery.
 - Inspect the snow shovel for damage.
 - Repair any damage before restarting and operating the snow shovel.
- Disconnect the tool Turn off the power switch and remove the battery when it is not in use, before servicing it, when changing accessories and when performing any other maintenance task.
- Store idle tool indoors When not in use, the cordless snow shovel should be stored indoors in a dry, locked place out of the reach of children.
- Maintain the cordless snow shovel with care Follow the applicable maintenance instructions for replacing parts and changing accessories. Lubrication is not required.



WARNING!

Improperly using or maintaining this cordless snow shovel could result in injury or death. To reduce this potential, comply with the following safety instructions.

This cordless snow shovel can amputate hands and feet if used incorrectly. It can also pick up foreign objects, which can become dangerous projectiles when thrown into the air. Failure to observe the following safety instructions could result in serious personal injury.

SAFE OPERATION PRACTICES FOR WALK-BEHIND SNOW SHOVEL

TRAINING

- Read, understand and follow all instructions on the machine and in the manual(s) before
 operating this unit. Be thoroughly familiar with the controls and the proper use of the equipment.
 Know how to stop the unit and disengage the controls quickly.
- Never allow children to operate the equipment. Never allow adults to operate the equipment without proper instruction.
- Keep the area of operation clear of all persons, particularly small children.
- Exercise caution to avoid slipping or falling, especially when operating the snow shovel in reverse.

PREPARATION

- Thoroughly inspect the area where the equipment is to be used and remove all doormats, sleds, boards, wires, and other foreign objects.
- Do not operate the equipment without wearing adequate winter garments. Avoid loose-fitting clothing that can get caught in moving parts. Wear footwear that will improve footing on slippery surfaces.
- Never attempt to make any adjustments while the motor is running (except when specifically recommended by manufacturer).
- Always wear safety glasses or eye shields during operation or while performing an adjustment or repair to protect eyes from foreign objects that may be thrown from the machine.

OPERATION

- Do not put hands or feet near or under rotating parts. Keep clear of the discharger opening at all times.
- Exercise extreme caution when operating on or crossing gravel drives, walks, or roads. Stay alert for hidden hazards or traffic.
- After striking a foreign object, stop the motor, remove the battery pack(s), thoroughly inspect the snow shovel for any damage, and repair the damage before restarting and operating the snow shovel.
- If the unit should start to vibrate abnormally, stop the motor and check immediately for the cause.
 Vibration is generally a warning of trouble.
- Stop the motor whenever you leave the operating position, before unclogging the auger assembly housing or rotor housing, and when making any repairs, adjustments or inspections.
- When clearing, repairing or inspecting the snow shovel, stop the motor and make certain the
 auger assembly and all moving parts have stopped. Remove the battery pack(s) to prevent
 someone from accidentally starting the motor.
- Exercise extreme caution when operating on slopes.
- Never operate the snow shovel without proper guards and other safety protective devices in place and working.
- Never direct the discharge toward people or areas where property damage can occur. Keep children and others away.

SAFETY GUIDELINES

- Do not overload the machine capacity by attempting to clear snow at too fast a rate.
- Disengage power to the auger assembly when the snow shovel is transported or not in use.
- Use only attachments and accessories approved by the manufacturer of the snow shovel (such as rubber paddles, scraper bar and drive belt).
- Never operate the snow shovel without good visibility or light. Always be sure of your footing, and keep a firm hold on the handles. Walk: never run.

CLEARING A CLOGGED ROTOR HOUSING

Hand contact with the rotating auger assembly inside the rotor housing is the most common cause of injury associated with snow shovels. Never use your hand to clean a cloqged rotor housing.

To clear the rotor housing:

- Shut the motor off and remove the battery.
- Wait 10 seconds to be sure the auger assembly blades have stopping rotating.
- Always use a clean-out tool, not your hands.

MAINTENANCE AND STORAGE

- Check all bolts or fasteners at frequent intervals for proper tightness to be sure the equipment is in safe working condition.
- Always refer to the operator's manual for important details if the snow shovel is to be stored for an extended period.
- Maintain or replace safety and instruction labels as necessary.
- Run the machine a few minutes after blowing snow to prevent freeze-up of the auger assembly.

SAFETY GUIDELINES FOR BATTERY-OPERATED TOOLS

- **Prevent unintentional starting.** Ensure the switch is in the off-position before connecting to battery pack, picking up or carrying the appliance. Carrying the appliance with your finger on the switch or energizing an appliance that has the switch on invites accidents.
- Disconnect the battery pack from the appliance before making any adjustments. **changing accessories, or storing appliance.** Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the appliance accidentally.
- Recharge only with the charger specified by the manufacturer. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.
- Use appliances only with specifically designated battery packs. Use of any other battery packs may create a risk of injury and fire.
- When battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws or other small metal objects, that can make a connection from **one terminal to another.** Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.
- Under abusive conditions, liquid may be elected from the battery; avoid contact, If contact accidentally occurs, flush with water. If liquid contacts eyes, seek additional

medical help. Liquid ejected from the battery may cause irritation or burns.

- Do not use a battery pack or appliance that is damaged or modified. Damaged or modified batteries may exhibit unpredictable behaviour resulting in fire, explosion or risk of injury.
- **Do not expose a battery pack or appliance to fire or excessive temperature.** Exposure to fire or temperature above 265°F (130°C) may cause an explosion.
- Follow all charging instructions and do not charge the battery pack or appliance
 outside of the temperature range specified in the instructions. Charging improperly or at
 temperatures outside of the specified range may damage the battery and increase the risk of fire.
- Have servicing performed by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the product is maintained.
- Do not modify or attempt to repair the appliance or the battery pack (as applicable) except as indicated in the instructions for use and care.


- **Do not use hands to unclog chute.** Stop motor before removing debris. Do not walk in front of running machine. Do not direct discharge at bystander.


- Remove the snow shovel from the package, and examine it carefully. Do not discard the carton or any
 packaging material until all parts have been examined.
- If any part of the snow shovel is missing or damaged, do not attach the battery pack to the tool or use the
 tool until the part has been repaired or replaced. Failure to heed this warning could result in serious injury.
- The safe use of this product requires an understanding of the information on the tool and in this instruction
 manual, as well as knowledge of the operation you are performing. Before use of this product, familiarize
 yourself with all operating features and safety rules.




ASSEMBLY


CONNECTING THE POLES (fig. 1-fig. 4)

- Slide the middle pole into the lower pole assembly.
 Align the screw holes (fig. 1).
- Insert the bolt through the square hole in the pole and secure the other end with the joint-fixing knob (fig. 2). Twist until tight.
- 3. Slide the upper pole assembly onto the middle pole. Align the screw holes (fig. 3).
- Insert the bolt through the square hole in the pole and secure the other end with the joint-fixing knob (fig. 4). Twist until tight.









NOTICE:

. You may have to carefully move the wiring inside the tube to one side if it blocks the path of the bolt.

TO ATTACH/DETACH THE BATTERY PACK (fig. 5)

- 1. Open the protective cap of the battery compartment.
- Align the raised portion on the battery pack with the grooves inside of the battery compartment, and then slide the battery pack onto the snow shovel.
- Ensure that the battery-release button on the battery pack snaps into place and the battery pack is secured to the tool before beginning operation.
- 4. Open the protective cap of the battery compartment.
- 5. Depress the battery-release button to release the battery and remove it from the tool.

STARTING/STOPPING THE SNOW SHOVEL (fig. 6)

- To start the cordless snow shovel, push and hold the safety lock switch on the side of the handle grip with your thumb and then squeeze the trigger switch with your fingers. Once the machine powers on, you can release the safety lock switch and proceed with operation.
- 2. To stop the cordless snow shovel, release the trigger switch.


HANDLE ADJUSTMENT (fig. 7-8)


To adjust the angle of the auxiliary handle, follow the instructions below:

- Stop the machine and remove the battery. Wait until the blade comes to a complete stop.
- Loosen the auxiliary handle by turning the handle knob counter-clockwise. Rotate the auxiliary handle to a comfortable position (fig. 7).
- 3. Secure the handle by tightening the handle knob. Insert the battery and resume working.

To adjust the position of the auxiliary handle, follow the instructions below:

- Stop the machine and remove the battery. Wait until the blade comes to a complete stop.
- Loosen handle knob slightly and adjust auxiliary handle as needed to desired position. Retighten handle knob securely (fig. 8).
- 3. Insert the battery and resume working.





OPERATING TIPS

- Start the cordless snow shovel. Push the shovel forward at a comfortable rate, yet slow enough to
 clear the path completely. The clearing width of the snow shovel and the depth of snowfall should
 dictate your forward speed.
- Direct the snow discharge to the right or to the left by holding the cordless snow shovel at a slight angle.
- To remove snow most efficiently, throw the snow downwind and slightly overlap each swath.
- If you need to clear snow from a crushed rock or gravel surface, push down on the handle to keep the scraper blade clear of any loose material that the rotor blades could throw.
- This cordless snow shovel cuts a path 11" (28 cm) wide and up to 9" (22.8 cm) deep in one pass.
- When clearing deeper drifts, hold the cordless snow shovel by the upper and auxiliary handles
 and use a swinging or sweeping motion. Remove up to 9" (22.8 cm) of snow with each pass and
 repeat as many times as needed.
- Remove the battery after using the cordless snow shovel. Hang the shovel so it will not be misplaced or damaged.



DANGER!

- Never use a snow shovel on frozen lakes, rivers, or similar surfaces. Death or serious injury could occur if the ice breaks.
- Never use the snow shovel on a rooftop or other unstable surface, which can result in death or serious personal injury.

NOTICE:

. In order to prevent the auxiliary handle from moving around or sliding on the pole, be sure to tighten securely.



WARNING!


- Do not use snow shovel on ice, which can cause the operator to slip and fall, resulting in possibly serious
 personal injury.
- Do not wear loose clothing, scarves, or jewellery. They can be caught in moving parts and cause death or serious personal injury.
- Keep all snow discharge pointed away from all electrical devices to reduce the risk of electrocution or electric shock.
- Never point the snow shovel or discharge chute in the direction of people or pets. Thrown snow or other
 objects can cause serious injuries.
- Make sure that the area to be cleared is free of stones, sticks, wires, gravel, and other objects that could be
 accidentally thrown by the snow shovel in any direction and cause serious personal injury to the operator
 and others. If the unit comes in contact with any type of obstruction or debris during use, stop the snow
 shovel, remove the battery pack(s), remove the obstruction, and inspect the unit carefully for damage before
 proceeding.
- Never reach into the rotor housing or place any body part in front of the snow shovel when the unit is
 operating or when the battery pack(s) are installed. Always ensure all moving parts have stopped and the
 battery pack(s) have been removed before clearing any obstructions. Failure to follow these instructions can
 result in serious personal injury.
- Take notice of the direction of the wind before beginning. When possible, discharge snow in the same direction as the wind to prevent snow from being thrown back into your face.
- Some parts of the snow shovel can freeze under extreme weather conditions. Do not attempt to operate the
 unit with frozen parts.
- When finished, allow the motor to run for an additional few minutes to prevent moving parts from freezing, then turn the chute rotation handle back and forth several times to free it from any ice buildup. Make sure to clean off any snow and ice from the base of the chute.
- In snowy and cold conditions, some controls and moving parts may freeze. Do not use excessive force when
 trying to operate frozen controls. If you have difficulty operating any control or part, start the machine as
 shown in "STARTING/STOPPING THE SNOW SHOVEL" section and let it run for a few minutes.

MAINTENANCE

REPLACING THE SCRAPER (fig. 9)

The scraper is located at the base of the snow shovel beneath the rotor housing.

- 1. Remove the battery pack(s) from the tool.
- 2. Detach the worn scraper from the snow shovel by removing the 3 screws as shown in fig. 9.
- 3. Install the new scraper and fasten it securely to the snow shovel with 3 screws.



STORAGE


- 1. Remove the battery from the cordless snow shovel before storing.
- Store the cordless snow shovel indoors in a locked, dry place out of the reach of children to prevent unauthorized use or damage.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Causes	Solution
The snow shovel doesn't work.	The battery pack is depleted.	Charge the battery pack.
	The battery or the tool is too hot.	Wait for the battery or tool to cool down, and then start the tool again.
	The battery pack is too cold.	Warm battery pack to room temperature and then use again.
	Safety switch is not depressed.	Press the safety switch and then squeeze the trigger switch.
The snow shovel leaves a thin layer of snow behind.	The scraper is worn.	Replace the scraper as shown in the section "REPLACING THE SCRAPER" in this manual.
