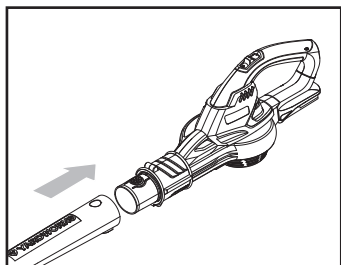

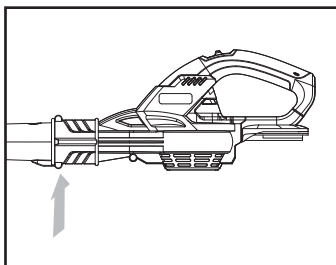
ASSEMBLING THE BLOWER TUBE (Fig. A1, Fig. A2, and Fig. A3)

Before assembling the blower tube (4), be sure the on/off switch (2) is in “O” Off position.

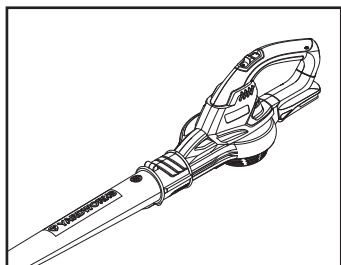
Fit the blower tube to the motor housing as shown in Fig. A1. Fix the blower tube to the blower port with the screw provided (Fig. A2). Check the blower tube is firmly secured (Fig. A3).

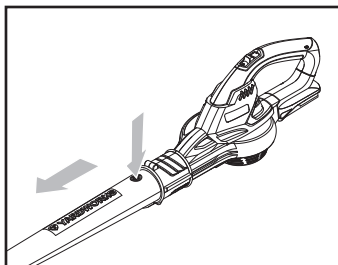


WARNING: Do not attempt to operate or disable the On/Off switch by any means other than the normal assembly or removal of the tube.

DISASSEMBLING THE BLOWER TUBE

NOTE: Before disassembling the blower tube, be sure the on/off switch (2) is in “O” Off position.

Loosen the screw. Press the release button (3), so that you can separate the tube (Fig. A4). Do not try to separate the tubes by force or by using tools.

1. BEFORE USING YOUR CORDLESS BLOWER

Your battery pack is UNCHARGED and you must charge once before use.

2. CHARGING YOUR BATTERY PACK

The Li-ion battery is protected against deep discharging. When the battery is empty, the machine is switched off by means of a protective circuit: the machine will stop running. In a warm environment or after heavy use, the battery pack may become too hot to permit charging. Allow time for the battery to cool down before recharging.

Please charge the battery to reach full or no less than half charge before storage. If the tool will not be used for long periods of time, charge the battery every 3—6 months.

- 1) Plug the charger into an appropriate outlet.
- 2) Place the battery pack into the charger.
- 3) When charging is completed, unplug the charger and remove the battery pack.



WARNING! The charger and battery pack are specially designed to work together so do not attempt to use any other devices. Never insert or allow metallic objects into your charger or battery pack connections because an electrical failure and hazard will occur.



WARNING: When battery charge runs out after continuous use or exposure to direct sunlight or heat, allow time for the battery to cool down before re-charging to achieve the full charge.

3. TO REMOVE OR INSTALL BATTERY PACK (See Fig. B)

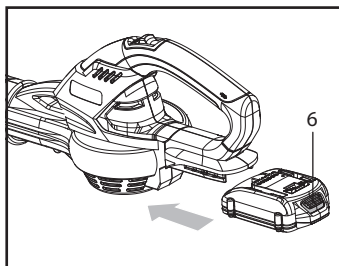
Depress the battery release button (6) to release battery pack from your tool. After recharging, insert the battery pack into tool's battery port. A simple push and slight pressure will be sufficient.

4. STARTING/STOPPING (See Fig. C)**Starting**

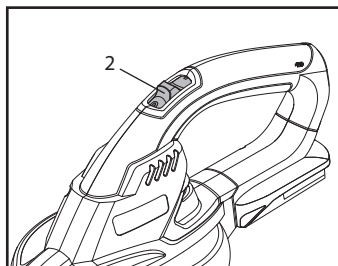
Move the On/Off switch (2) to the "I" On position.

Stopping

Move the On/Off switch (2) to the "O" Off position.

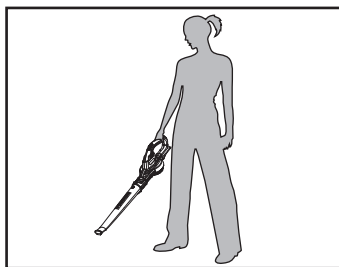
WARNING! The tool runs for a few seconds after it has been switched off. Let the motor come to a complete standstill before setting the tool down.

5. USING THE BLOWER (See Fig. D)

The blower is intended for residential use only. Use the blower outdoors to move debris from hard surfaces. This blower is not designed to clear leaves from large grassy areas, or move wet, heavy debris.

USER TIPS

- Hold the blow tube approx 7" (17.8 cm) above the ground when operating the tool. Use a sweeping motion from side to side. Advance slowly keeping the accumulated debris/leaves in front of you.
- After blowing the debris/leaves into a pile, it is easy to dispose of the pile.

**D****CAUTION!**

Do not blow hard objects such as nails, bolts, or rocks.
Use extra care when cleaning debris from stairs or other tight areas.
Wear safety goggles or other suitable eye protection, long pants, and shoes.

Storage

WARNING: Store the blower indoors, in a cool dry location, out of reach of children and animals.

Maintenance

Clean the tool regularly.



WARNING: Always remove or disconnect battery pack before adjusting, cleaning, servicing or transporting the blower vacuum.









WARNING:
Keep your product dry. Under no circumstances spray with water.
To clean the tool, use only mild soap and a damp cloth.

Do not use any type of detergent, cleaner or solvent which may contain chemicals that could seriously damage the plastic. Self lubricating bearings are used in your product, therefore lubrication is not required.
